10 AMENDMENT NO. 1. Page 1, strike the stricken title, enacting clause
11 and entire bill and insert

12 "An Act related to salaries and compensation;
13 rejecting certain report of the Board on Judicial
14 Compensation; amending certain judicial salaries to
15 take effect on certain date; providing for
16 noncodification; providing an effective date; and
17 declaring an emergency.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
20 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

21 Pursuant to the authority provided in Section 3.2 of Title 20 of
22 the Oklahoma Statutes to reject judicial salaries established by the
23 Board on Judicial Compensation, the Oklahoma Legislature hereby
24 rejects the Final Report of the Board on Judicial Compensation,
issued on November 18, 2019.

1 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
2 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

3 The Oklahoma Legislature hereby amends judicial salaries to take
4 effect July 1, 2020. The amended salary schedule provided for in
5 this section provides a salary increase of four and five-tenths
6 percent (4.5%) above the salary levels existing during fiscal year
7 2020 for positions listed as follows; all other judicial salaries
8 shall remain at the levels that existed as of January 1, 2020:

- 9 Chief Justice of the Supreme Court
- 10 Justice of the Supreme Court
- 11 Presiding Judge of the Court of Civil Appeals
- 12 Judge of the Court of Civil Appeals
- 13 Presiding Judge of the Court of Criminal Appeals
- 14 Judge of the Court of Criminal Appeals
- 15 District Judges
- 16 Associate District Judges
- 17 Special District Judges.

18 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2020.

19 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
20 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
21 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
22 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.”

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

A. Effective July 1, 2019, all full-time and part-time officers
and employees, including temporary and other limited-term employees,
of the state who were employed by the state on the last working day
of June 2019 shall be awarded an annualized salary increase equal to
Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00).

B. As used in this section, "temporary and other limited-term
employees" are those persons who:

1. Are not full-time or permanent employees;
2. Are not otherwise excluded by this section; and

1 3. Are compensated by an agency, board, commission or
2 department or other employing entity for a limited duration without
3 any subjective expectation by either the employer or the employee
4 that the employment will become permanent.

5 C. Except for those personnel specifically excluded from
6 eligibility for any increase or advancement in salary pursuant to
7 this section, the salary increase provided by this section shall be
8 applicable to:

- 9 1. Employees of county health departments;
- 10 2. Employees of a conservation district; and
- 11 3. Employees of the George Nigh Rehabilitation Institute.

12 D. Employees eligible for the increase provided for in
13 subsection A of this section who are on leave without pay on July 1,
14 2019, shall receive an annualized increase, effective upon their
15 return to work, but shall not receive any increase for a period of
16 time prior to their return to work.

17 E. Employees who leave the state's service before July 1, 2019,
18 who are reinstated or reemployed in the state's service during July
19 2019 without a break in service and who are otherwise eligible for
20 the pay increase provided for in this section shall be granted such
21 raise effective immediately upon such reinstatement or reemployment.
22 As used in this subsection, "break in service" is defined as a
23 period of time in excess of thirty (30) calendar days between two
24 (2) periods of state employment.

1 F. The following officers and employees shall be ineligible for
2 a pay increase pursuant to this section and nothing, except as
3 otherwise provided by Section 840-2.17 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma
4 Statutes, shall be construed to authorize any increase or
5 advancement of the salaries of:

6 1. Any elected official;

7 2. Any cabinet secretary whose salary is governed by Section
8 10.5 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

9 3. Any agency director;

10 4. Any justice or judge whose salary is governed by the
11 provisions of Title 85A of the Oklahoma Statutes or whose
12 compensation is set by the Board on Judicial Compensation pursuant
13 to Section 3.4 of Title 20 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

14 5. Any district attorney whose salary is governed by Section
15 215.30 of Title 19 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

16 6. Officers and employees of institutions under the
17 administrative authority of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
18 Education, except for officers and employees of the George Nigh
19 Rehabilitation Institute;

20 7. Persons employed pursuant to Section 2241 of Title 74 of the
21 Oklahoma Statutes;

22 8. Persons employed pursuant to Section 1.6a of Title 53 of the
23 Oklahoma Statutes;

1 9. Persons who are employed or under contract pursuant to
2 subsection B of Section 1419 of Title 10 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
3 and

4 10. The Adjutant General and Assistant Adjutants General
5 pursuant to Section 27 of Title 44 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

6 G. No salary increase pursuant to this section shall be made
7 that exceeds a salary limitation provided in an agency's annual
8 appropriation bill or salary limits set by statute. Classified
9 employees eligible for the salary increase provided for in this
10 section shall receive such increase even though it causes the
11 employee's salary to exceed the maximum for the employee's pay band.

12 H. With respect to any employee who is not a full-time
13 employee, the salary increase amount otherwise authorized by
14 subsection A of this section shall be prorated using a methodology
15 applicable to the employee's compensation, weeks worked, months
16 worked, hours worked or similar method.

17 SECTION 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.

18 SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
19 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
20 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
21 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
