7 An Act relating to law enforcement; amending 57 O.S.
8 2011, Section 509.2, which relates to patrol and law
9 enforcement in the town of Taft; modifying certain
10 patrol obligations; and providing an effective date.

11 AUTHORS: Remove Representative Humphrey as principal House author
12 and substitute with Representative Taylor.

13 Add as House coauthors: Newton and Pae

14 AUTHOR: Remove Senator Shaw as principal Senate author and
15 substitute with Senator Montgomery.

16 AMENDMENT NO. 1. Delete the title, enacting clause and entire bill
17 and replace with:

18 "An Act relating to cities and towns; stating
19 legislative intent; terminating certain temporary
20 budget option upon certain circumstances; creating
21 the Municipal Government COVID-19 Emergency Budget
22 Act; authorizing municipal governments to adopt a
23 temporary budget; listing certain temporary budget
24 process requirements; providing for noncodification;
providing for codification; and declaring an
emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
2 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

3 The Municipal Government COVID-19 Emergency Budget Act is
4 intended to serve as a short-term budget solution for municipal
5 governments due to the extreme volatility in sales tax revenue
6 projections resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic and municipal
7 government reliance on sales tax revenue for general operations.
8 The Municipal Government COVID-19 Emergency Budget Act shall
9 terminate as an optional budget preparation procedure after the
10 implementation of the 2021 fiscal year municipal budgets.

11 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
12 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 17-115.2 of Title 11, unless
13 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

14 A. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Municipal
15 Government COVID-19 Emergency Budget Act".

16 B. Municipal governments may adopt a temporary budget for the
17 2021 fiscal year if the municipal governing body determines adopting
18 a yearly budget is not in the best interest of the municipal
19 government due to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on revenue
20 projections. The temporary budget process shall comply with the
21 following provisions:

22 1. The temporary budget shall not exceed six (6) months in
23 duration;

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1 2. At the conclusion of the temporary budget the municipal
2 government shall adopt a permanent budget for the duration of the
3 fiscal year;

4 3. The temporary budget may be altered or otherwise amended
5 following standard budgeting procedures;

6 4. In adopting the permanent budget for the 2021 fiscal budget
7 year the municipal government shall comply with all provisions of
8 the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act and shall comply with deadlines within
9 the Municipal Budget Act as provided in Sections 17-201 through 17-
10 216 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes and the Estimate of Needs
11 Law as provided in Sections 3001 through 3033 of Title 68 of the
12 Oklahoma Statutes and Section 461 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma
13 Statutes, provided that the deadlines may be moved to a later date
14 in the year so long as the total length of required notice has been
15 met;

16 5. The municipal government shall comply with all provisions of
17 the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act when adopting the temporary municipal
18 budget. Additionally, the municipal government shall provide notice
19 of the meeting where the temporary budget will be considered five
20 (5) days prior to the meeting. The notice shall include the time,
21 date, and place of the meeting. The notice shall also identify and
22 list the website, if available, or other location where copies of
23 the temporary budget or a temporary budget summary will be available
24 for public inspection. In adopting the temporary budget for the

1 2021 fiscal budget year the municipal government shall be exempt
2 from any budget preparation notice and publication requirements
3 within the Municipal Budget Act as provided in Sections 17-201
4 through 17-216 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes and the Estimate
5 of Needs Law as provided in Sections 3001 through 3033 of Title 68
6 of the Oklahoma Statutes and Section 461 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma
7 Statutes;

8 6. Adoption of the temporary budget under the provisions of the
9 Municipal Government COVID-19 Emergency Budget Act shall be deemed
10 sufficient for all requirements and obligations of municipal
11 governments concerning the adoption of a municipal budget; provided
12 that any previous contractual obligation of a municipality dependent
13 on the passage of a municipal budget may be fulfilled by either the
14 temporary budget or the permanent budget at the discretion of the
15 municipal governing body; and

16 7. The temporary budget options outlined in this section may be
17 utilized by municipal governments operating under the Estimate of
18 Needs Law as provided in Sections 3001 through 3033 of Title 68 of
19 the Oklahoma Statutes and Section 461 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma
20 Statutes, or Municipal Budget Act budgets pursuant to Sections 17-
21 201 through 17-216 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

22 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
23 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
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1 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2 be in full force from and after its passage and approval."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

11 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 57 O.S. 2011, Section 509.2, is
12 amended to read as follows:

13 Section 509.2. ~~A. In addition to their other security and~~
14 ~~oversight obligations, the Department of Corrections shall patrol~~
15 ~~the perimeters of the Jess Dunn Correctional Center and the George~~
16 ~~Nigh Training Center and also make patrols through the town of Taft.~~

17 B. Due to the unusual circumstance that ~~the facilities named in~~
18 ~~Section 1 of this act~~ two prison facilities are so closely situated
19 to the town of Taft and for the further reason that ~~said~~ the town is
20 without any local law enforcement officer on an ongoing basis, it is
21 the intent of the Legislature that the Department of Public Safety
22 shall ~~establish a permanent trooper position to be based and~~
23 ~~stationed in the,~~ upon request and when possible, offer law
24 enforcement assistance to the town of Taft.
