7 PROPOSED COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

8 An Act relating to teachers; requiring emergency-  
9 certified teachers to complete professional  
10 development training prior to teaching; authorizing  
11 training for new certified teachers; directing school  
12 district to provide training; permitting cooperation  
13 with other districts or higher education  
14 institutions; prescribing content for training;  
15 mandating additional training throughout the year;  
16 requiring mentor for support, guidance and advice;  
17 providing for codification; and providing an  
18 effective date.

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

20 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-195.3 of Title 70, unless  
22 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

23 A. A person who is issued an emergency certificate by the State  
24 Board of Education pursuant to subsection F of Section 6-187 of  
Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes and who does not already hold a  
standard certificate shall complete no less than two (2) days of  
professional development training as provided in subsection C of

1 this section prior to entering the classroom. A school district may  
2 also require a new certified teacher to complete no less than two  
3 (2) days of professional development training as provided in  
4 subsection C of this section prior to entering the classroom.

5 B. The training shall be offered by the employing school  
6 district. School districts may cooperate with other districts or  
7 contract with an institution of higher education to offer the  
8 training.

9 C. The training described in this section shall include, but  
10 not be limited to, the following professional development:

- 11 1. Classroom management skills;
- 12 2. School procedures and policies;
- 13 3. Subject-specific instructional methods; and
- 14 4. Writing lesson plans.

15 D. The school district shall provide additional training  
16 opportunities for teachers with emergency certification throughout  
17 the school year. In addition to an instructional coach, the school  
18 principal shall also arrange a mentor to provide support, guidance  
19 and advice to the emergency-certified teacher on an ongoing basis.

20 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
