9 FLOOR SUBSTITUTE

10 An Act relating to professions and occupations;  
11 authorizing the State Board of Medical Licensure and  
12 Supervision and the State Board of Osteopathic  
13 Examiners to issue certain guidance; authorizing  
14 Boards to take disciplinary action against certain  
15 physicians; providing for codification; and declaring  
16 an emergency.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 510.1 of Title 59, unless there  
20 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

21 A. The State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision is  
22 hereby authorized to issue guidance to all allopathic physicians in  
23 this state on the recommending of medical marijuana to patients.

24 B. The Board may take disciplinary action as provided for in  
the Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and

1 Supervision Act against any allopathic physician who willfully  
2 violates or aids another in the willful violation of the provisions  
3 of Section 420 et seq. of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

4 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
5 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 638.1 of Title 59, unless there  
6 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

7 A. The State Board of Osteopathic Examiners is hereby  
8 authorized to issue guidance to all osteopathic physicians in this  
9 state on the recommending of medical marijuana to patients.

10 B. The Board may take disciplinary action as provided for in  
11 the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act against any osteopathic  
12 physician who willfully violates or aids another in the willful  
13 violation of the provisions of Section 420 et seq. of Title 63 of  
14 the Oklahoma Statutes.

15 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
16 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby  
17 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
18 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
