13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 46.5 of Title 62, unless there
16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 A. There is hereby created **until July 1, 2023**, the "State
18 Revenue Apportionment Evaluation Commission".

19 B. The Commission shall consist of nine (9) members to be
20 appointed or selected as follows:

21 1. Two persons appointed by the Governor;

22 2. Two persons to be appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma
23 House of Representatives, **one member of the majority party and one
24 member of the minority party;**

1 3. Two persons to be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of
2 the Oklahoma State Senate, **one member of the majority party and one**
3 **member of the minority party;**

4 4. The Executive Director of the Oklahoma Tax Commission or a
5 designee;

6 5. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
7 Services or a designee; and

8 6. The State Treasurer or a designee.

9 C. Any person appointed to the Commission pursuant to
10 subsection B of this section shall serve at the pleasure of the
11 appointing authority and may be removed by such appointing authority
12 without cause.

13 D. The Commission shall hold an organizational meeting not
14 later than sixty (60) days after the effective date of this act and
15 shall select from among its membership a chair and vice-chair.

16 E. The Commission shall be subject to the provisions of the
17 Oklahoma Open Meeting Act and the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

18 F. The Commission shall be authorized to meet as often as
19 required in order to perform the duties imposed upon it by law.

20 G. Staff assistance to the Commission shall be provided by the
21 Oklahoma House of Representatives, the Oklahoma State Senate, the
22 Office of Management and Enterprise Services and the Oklahoma Tax
23 Commission.

1 H. The Commission shall analyze the state revenue system with
2 special emphasis on the amount of revenue which is apportioned for
3 purposes other than expenditures from the General Revenue Fund of
4 the State Treasury. The Commission shall prepare a summary, within
5 one hundred twenty (120) days after the end of each fiscal year, of
6 the revenue sources which are apportioned to destinations other than
7 the General Revenue Fund, the amount of revenue apportioned to those
8 sources or purposes and the tax or other revenue system from which
9 the apportionment is derived, the total amount of revenue from the
10 state tax and revenue structure that is apportioned for purposes
11 other than expenditures from the General Revenue Fund, a summary of
12 any changes to apportionments enacted during the immediately
13 preceding regular session of the Legislature and any other
14 information which the Commission determines to be necessary for a
15 complete analysis of the topic of apportioned revenues.

16 I. The annual report required by subsection H of this section
17 shall be delivered to the Governor, the Speaker of the Oklahoma
18 House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the State
19 Senate by the deadline prescribed in subsection H of this section.
20 The annual report shall also be posted to the Internet website of
21 the Oklahoma Tax Commission.

22 ~~SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.~~

23 ~~SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation~~
24 ~~of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby~~
