11 An Act relating to the State Department of
12 Rehabilitation Services; requiring that portions of
13 certain appropriated funds be used for certain
14 purposes; prohibiting supplantation of funding;
15 requiring a certain amount of funding to be budgeted
16 for a stated purpose; authorizing requests for early
17 transfers of certain funds for specific purposes;
18 providing for lapse of funds under certain conditions
19 requiring certain budget procedures; and prohibiting
20 certain budget procedures.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

22 SECTION 1. From the funds appropriated to the State Department
23 of Rehabilitation Services in Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1922 of the
24 2nd Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Five
Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) shall be used for increased
funding for contracts with organizations that seek to empower blind

1 or vision impaired individuals to achieve their maximum potential
2 through rehabilitation, employment and community outreach.

3 SECTION 2. From the funds appropriated to the State Department
4 of Rehabilitation Services in Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1922 of the
5 2nd Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Two Million
6 Four Hundred Eight Thousand Nine Hundred Twenty-one Dollars
7 (\$2,408,921.00) shall be used for capital improvements at the
8 Oklahoma School for the Deaf located in Sulphur, Oklahoma.

9 SECTION 3. From the funds appropriated to the State Department
10 of Rehabilitation Services in Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1922 of the
11 2nd Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of One Hundred
12 Forty-nine Thousand Seven Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$149,760.00) shall
13 be used for the maintenance of the Oklahoma School for the Blind
14 located in Muskogee, Oklahoma. These funds shall not supplant
15 current maintenance funding and the agency shall budget no less than
16 the total of the amount budgeted in the fiscal year ending June 30,
17 2019, plus the amount listed above for this purpose.

18 SECTION 4. From the funds appropriated to the State Department
19 of Rehabilitation Services in Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1922 of the
20 2nd Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of One Hundred
21 Eighty-four Thousand Three Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$184,320.00)
22 shall be used for the maintenance of the Oklahoma School for the
23 Deaf located in Sulphur, Oklahoma. These funds shall not supplant
24 current maintenance funding and the agency shall budget no less than

1 the total of the amount budgeted in the fiscal year ending June 30,
2 2019, plus the amount listed above for this purpose.

3 SECTION 5. From the funds appropriated to the State Department
4 of Rehabilitation Services in Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1922 of the
5 2nd Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Eighteen
6 Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-seven Dollars (\$18,267.00) shall be used
7 for the remaining two (2) months of the teacher pay raise.

8 SECTION 6. The Director of the State Department of
9 Rehabilitation Services may request through the Director of the
10 Office of Management and Enterprise Services the early transfer by
11 the Oklahoma Tax Commission of tax collections to the General
12 Revenue Fund for the purpose of early allocation to the Department's
13 disbursing funds to alleviate cash-flow problems.

14 SECTION 7. Appropriations made by Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1922
15 of the 2nd Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature not including
16 appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for
17 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021 (hereafter FY-21), or may be
18 budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022 (hereafter FY-22).
19 Funds budgeted for FY-21 may be encumbered only through June 30,
20 2021 and must be expended by November 15, 2021. Any funds remaining
21 after November 15, 2021, and not budgeted for FY-22, shall lapse to
22 the credit of the proper fund for the then-current fiscal year.
23 Funds budgeted for FY-22 may be encumbered only through June 30,
24 2022. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2022, shall lapse to

1 the credit of the proper fund for the then-current fiscal year.
2 These appropriations shall not be budgeted in both fiscal years
3 simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-21, and not required to pay
4 obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-22, after
5 the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared
6 and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds
7 from the FY-21 budget work program and after such revision has been
8 approved by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.

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
