Research Analysis

The committee substitute to HB 1298 modifies the list of crimes under which the court must send a notice to the Department of Public Safety ordering the Department to cancel or deny driving privileges. The measure provides that upon receipt of a third or subsequent notification from a court for the same person, the Department is to cancel or deny driving privileges for 2 years. The measure clarifies revocations relating to any felony in which a motor vehicle is used to require that the person be in actual physical control of the motor vehicle during the commission of a felony. The measure allows a first license revocation to be modified. The measure provides that a second or subsequent revocation for failure to pay for gasoline is for 1 year if a prior revocation commenced within the preceding 5 year period. The bill establishes a procedure for persons who are revoked to petition for relief for hardship in district court. The measure limits a provisional license operator to operate a motor vehicle only during the hours of 12 a.m. to 6 a.m. The measure provides that any person who can demonstrate enrollment in a federal or state assistance program including but not limited to Social Security or the Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program is to be granted a modified payment plan upon request. The measure modifies the eligibility for a provisional license.
