**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 1799 in its current form authorizes the Secretary of State to electronically publish the Oklahoma Statutes and Session Laws and repeals the provision requiring the Secretary of State to provide printed copies of the Oklahoma Statutes and Sessions Laws to certain members of the Legislative, Executive and Judicial branches of state government and various political subdivisions.

Officials for the Secretary of State estimate costs savings to the agency as a result of SB HB 1799 in amounts as follows: FY21 - \$614,326; FY22 - \$265,205; FY23 - \$273,191; FY24 - \$281,417; and FY25 - \$289,889.

Should agencies of the Legislative, Executive and Judicial branches of state government and various political subdivisions desire to continue to receive printed volumes of Oklahoma Statutes and Session Laws, such entities would bear the costs as purchasing such printed volumes, should HB 1799 become law.
