Research Analysis

SB 1525 requires applicants for allopathic and osteopathic medicine to undergo national criminal history checks. Information resulting from the criminal background checks may not be distributed outside the state. Further, the measure states that the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision and the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners have exclusive authority to determine the qualifications of applicants.
