Research Analysis

SB 1566 allows offenders supervised by the Department of Corrections or a private supervision provider on probation to earn discharge credits for compliance with the terms and conditions of probation supervision. The measure requires the supervising body to award 30 days of credit to an offender that successfully complies with the terms of his or her probation for a calendar month. Persons convicted of assault and battery or an 85% crime are not eligible to receive credit.
