**Research Analysis**

The floor amendment for SB 1714 amends the Home Bakery Act of 2013 by renaming it the Homemade Food Freedom Act, removing the \$20,000 sales limit, and expanding the eligible food types and labeling requirements. The measure allows producers to sell their homemade food directly to consumers, both in-person or through a delivery service. Meat or meat byproducts are not allowed in any form. Producers are exempt from licensing and all requirements of the State Department of Health and the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry. Lastly, the measure allows small-scale beekeepers to sell honey or honeycomb through the mail or in person using a representative, if desired.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The measure relates to the Homemade Food Freedom Act. With amended language, the bill defines regulation changes, classifies sales, licensing, delivery, labeling, and quality care of homemade products sold to the public. The stating act shall not be construed to impede investigation by state agencies under certain circumstances. As written, there is no anticipated fiscal impact to this measure.
