Research Analysis

Senate Bill 1805 authorizes the Oklahoma Board of Private Vocational Schools to:

- Develop and present optional training for schools to emphasize continuing development of school personnel
- Conduct announced or unannounced site visits to an applicant or licensed school or seminar
- Invoice a travel fee to conduct site visits
- Collect, or require the submission of data to be reported to the U.S. Department of Education, any state or federal agency, or an accrediting organization

The measure also authorizes the Board to approve or disapprove of applications for sustained licenses. Further, the measure allows a private vocational school to obtain a sustained license if that school is accredited by an accrediting organization approved by the U.S. Department of Education for multiple years.

Lastly, SB 1805 changes, and adds, review fees that private schools must pay to the Board. The measure also establishes fees for in-state site visits, and trainings, conducted by the Board.
