**Bill Analysis**

SB 266 requires each school district to adopt policies related to suicide awareness and training and the reporting of student drug abuse beginning with the 2019-2020 school year. This includes adopting a training program and providing the program made available by the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse. Teachers, students, and administrators are granted immunity from employment discipline and civil liability for carrying out certain actions enumerated by the measure.

FY'20 Impact: \$100.00-\$6000.00

If a school district chooses not to use the free resources provided by DMHSAS and instead selects a training program from the list maintained by DMHSAS, there may be a cost to purchase the training program. Based on the information received from DMHSAS, it would cost approximately \$100-\$6,000 per site depending on the chosen curricula and the target population. In addition, school districts may incur cost for training facilitation and preparation.
